We've lived by that mission statement since we built the addition in 2005, but the Great Commission has always been the power behind what the church does.

In our desire to fulfill the Great Commission, we see some wonderful opportunities ahead of us. To enable us to take on those opportunities, we have to confront the challenge of resources. To help us accomplish these goals, we have hired the Lutheran Church Extension Fund (LCEF) as our consultant.

Our Mission

In prayer, we have a heart for the hungry and the homeless. In action, we have helped both. LCEF asks congregations who carry out campaigns to use some of the resources raised to help others. We saw this as an opportunity for our church. Our leadership team has talked for years about finding a project that is big enough for all of us to participate.

We've had preliminary discussions with Habitat for Humanity of Ontario County. We would be a major supporter, which would give us some perks in the house build. We are partners with Family Promise, an organization that helps homeless families to get stabilized. Habitat is willing to consider a Family Promise family for the house we would help build.

Pastor Office Expansion

Although Pastor Bode has declined our call, we know that God has a pastor in mind for us. Our Call Committee is returning to that search. We want to be properly staffed to provide ministry

both within our congregation and into our community. When our next pastor arrives, he will find a congregation energized and engaged in the ministry to which God has called us.

Sanctuary Renovation and Plant Updating

Updating our sanctuary, installing new flooring, and other improvements help convey our respect for God. That's really important. We want our house of worship to be a warm and welcoming place, reflecting what God has done for us. Our hope is that the sixty percent of people in our community who don't know Jesus will find that warmth and welcoming here, as well. This building has been used by many generations. FOR GENERATIONS TO COME..., this work will help us welcome new generations.

Jesus gave the command Go! Make disciples FOR GENERATIONS TO COME! We know the joy of discipleship. Now is the time to make disciples. At the same time, we don't want to lose sight of disciple-making FOR GERNERATIONS TO COME....

Now is the time to live "a life worthy of the calling" that Jesus Christ has given us! (Ephesians 4:1)

Let's get GOing!

In what sorts of activities will the children participate related to the butterfly theme?


