A couple of weeks ago, Bob Smith shared the sermon message.

In it, he mentioned that the president of our Eastern District, Pastor Chris Wicher, commented that he knows that Good Shepherd is a pretty unique congregation. I totally agree with him. It is unique in many ways.

The members of our congregation understand what it means to be committed to Jesus Christ and to His ministry. You show it by the time, talents, and treasure that you invest here. We have seen those investments pay off in blessings to many people in our community. We show our care through CCIA, Christmas Baskets, Operation Christmas Child, donations to Lutheran World Relief, which notes that we are among the top fifty donor Lutheran congregations in the United States.

So, our next step out in faith is bigger, but not different. Our partnership with Habitat establishes a relationship that connects us to this community in a very organic way, joining two organizations that are helping families. It is also challenges to us, which helps to keep us healthy. It is an opportunity for all of us to be involved on some level in one project together.

We've already seen that within the campaign. Everyone who has joined is excited about this opportunity to become involved. We are getting to know each other better by working together. That's one of the truths of the church. In business, work is there to get accomplished. In the church, work is there to create relationships that get the work accomplished.

Another part of that unique character is that we ask you to sign a covenant. I talked about this the first week of the campaign. A covenant is not a contractual or transactional agreement: "If you do this for me, I'll do that for you." It is a relationship agreement. We are in this together to accomplish God's purpose.

On November 20 and 21, we're asking you to return a Commitment Card that will be provided, asking you to recommit to the four tenets of our covenant: to protect the unity of our church, to share the responsibility of our church, to serve

the ministry of our church, and to support the testimony of our church.

When our campaign consultant heard that we use a covenant, he was really enthusiastic about that. It sets before us the relationship that we expect of each other. He made the comment, which I think is really neat, that if we didn't receive one dollar from this campaign, but every one of our members recommitted to those tenets, we would be a stronger and more powerful congregation. He is 100% correct. The campaign is not about money. It's about commitment.

However, committed people always put their time, talents, and treasure at the service of our Lord, Jesus. They often do it in immeasurably greater ways. That's the ultimate commitment we're making. It's in response to the commitment that Jesus made to all of us. He gave Himself to die for us so that we might live for Him. He gave so we could be with Him. We give so that all may come to know Him. It's one of the ways we serve God by serving others.
