

"LENT IN PLAIN SIGHT" THEME FOR THIS WEEK: "OIL"

Oil is used in many ways in the Bible. One of them was to anoint people to show that they were chosen by God for some special task. It was also used to mark people at Baptism or to use as a sign for healing. We still use it in our baptism service and when people are sick. Oil was used as a physical method of healing. Typically, it was olive oil that was used with wine added as the antiseptic, as in the story of the Good Samaritan. At the time of Jesus, the oil was likely olive oil, which also tastes good. Bring a gift of olive oil, or your choice, this week. We'll pass it along to CCIA for people to use in whatever way they need.

"LENT IN PLAIN SIGHT" THEME FOR NEXT WEEK: "COATS & TOWELS"

Our Holy Week celebration begins with people laying palms or their coats along the road for Jesus to enter Jerusalem. In the middle of it, we hear that Jesus wrapped a towel about Him and washed the feet of His disciples. To help us share in this if you have gently used coats or towels, or can find either on clearance, bring them. We'll pass the coats along to St. Vincent de Paul to share with our neighbors. Depending on how many towels we get we'll share them with Family Promise or Happy Tails Animal Shelter.
