The kids have chosen their Sunday School mission project for this year. We are very excited to announce that we're making Baby Care Kits!! Everyone is invited to help with the project. This is a project sponsored by Lutheran World Relief. The kits will be sent to a country where new moms cannot afford to provide these things for their babies. We will need lightweight t-shirts (no onesies), long or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers without feet, receiving blankets (cotton or flannel or knit or crocheted with lightweight yarn, cloth diapers (flat fold), jackets, sweaters, or sweatshirts with hoods (or include a cap), socks, hand towels (dark color), bath-sized bars of gentle baby soap, and diaper pins. The sizes needed can be anything from 6 to 24 months. Please place items in the basket on the Mission Central shelf in the
