

ANOTHER WAY TO GIVE

If you prefer the convenience of offering your gift via your smartphone there is a way to do that. Go to the Apple Store or Google Play and search for "Vanco Mobile Faith Engagement" (the half purple V) to download for free. Then enter Good Shepherd; next tap Donate Now. 3. Choose a fund and a preset amount or enter another amount. You can make a one-time donation or set up recurring giving right through the app. Select Add to add another fund or move forward to the payment information. 4. Scan or enter your card or bank account information. 5. Review your donation summary then select Complete Donation. Or if you prefer to have your gift automatically withdrawn from your checking or savings account, check that box on the right side of your connection card, "Automating My Giving" or contact the church office and we will provide you with the form you will need to complete in order for us to set that up. Please remember that the Give Plus Mobile App will no longer be available as of April 30.

The kids have chosen their Sunday School mission project for this year. We are very excited to announce that we're making Baby Care Kits!! Everyone is invited to help with the project. This is a project sponsored by Lutheran World Relief. The kits will be sent to a country where new moms cannot afford to provide these things for their babies. We will need lightweight t-shirts (no onesies), long or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers without feet, receiving blankets (cotton or flannel or knit or crocheted with lightweight yarn, cloth diapers (flat fold), jackets, sweaters, or sweatshirts with hoods (or include a cap), socks, hand towels (dark color), bath-sized bars of gentle baby soap, and diaper pins. The sizes needed can be anything from 6 to 24 months. Please place items in the basket on the Mission Central shelf in the coatroom.
