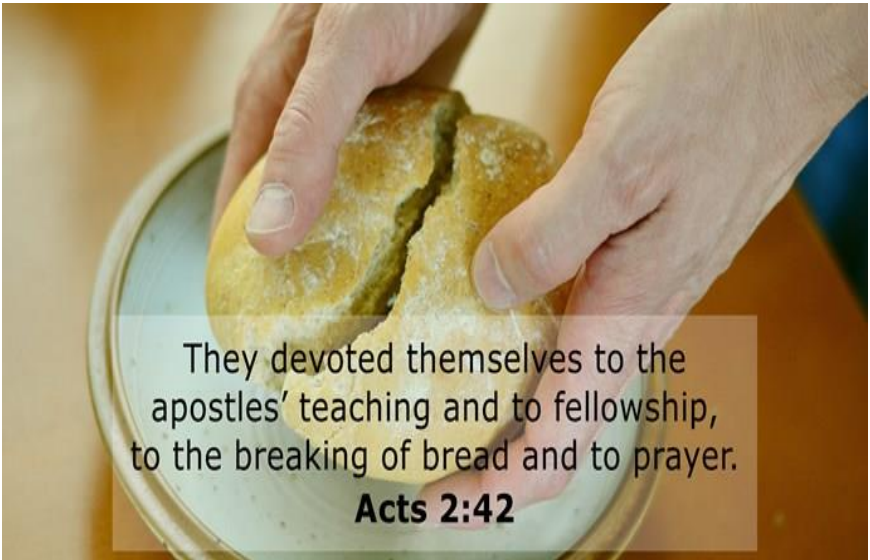

Choose a fund and a preset amount or enter another amount. You can make a one-time donation or set up recurring giving right through the app. Select *Add* to add another fund or move forward to the payment information. 4. Scan or enter your card or bank account information. 5. Review your donation summary then select *Complete Donation*. Or if you prefer to have your gift automatically withdrawn from your checking or savings account, check that box on the right side of your connection card, "Automating My Giving" or contact the church office and we will provide you with the form you will need to complete in order for us to set that up. Please remember that the Give Plus Mobile App will no longer be available as of April 30.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS, APRIL 4, 4 – 6 PM

We are privileged to have an amazing place to walk the Stations of the Cross this year. **Notre Dame Retreat Center** has opened their grounds to us on the evening of Tuesday, April 4th between the hours of 4 – 6 PM. The stations are rendered in metal statuary set in a peaceful setting with Canandaigua Lake and the surrounding hills as a backdrop. They tell the

story of Jesus' suffering from the moment He is condemned to die until He is laid in the tomb.

To guide your walk, volunteers from our church will read the scripture depicted in each statue. Then you'll be given time to reflect and pray before going to the next station.
