

THE SIGN OF THE CROSS

One of the outward signs we may use to denote that we are a Christian is the Sign of the Cross. At our baptism it is applied to us both before and after our baptism. Signing does not make us a better Christian, but does remind us that we are not our own. It is in a sense, an outward marking of the inward brand we received at our baptism.

The Signing of the Cross is made whenever the name of the Trintiy is spoken. It may also be made as we receive the bread and wine, the body and blood of our Lord, in the Eucharist. The places in the liturgy where it may correctly be used are marked (+) to assist you in adding this to your worship style if God leads you to do so.
