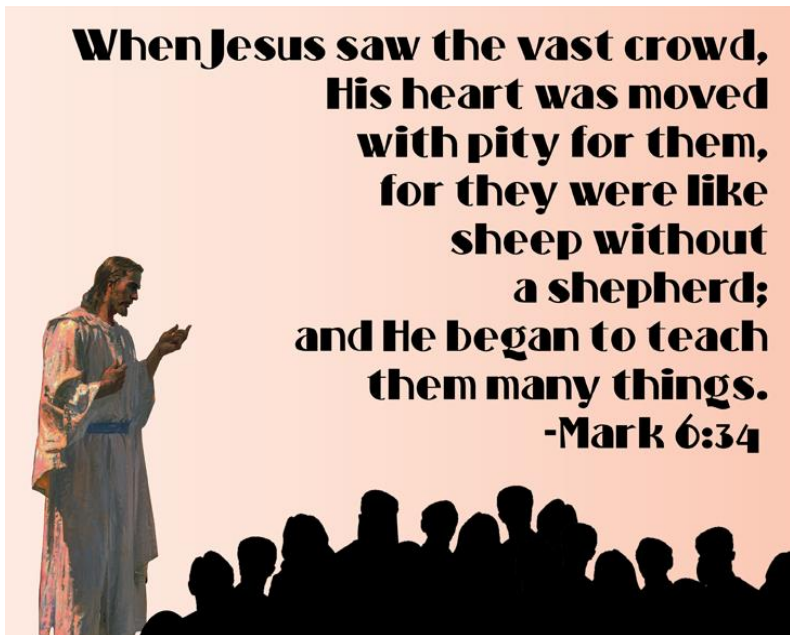

My whole body is sick; my health is broken because of my sins.
My guilt overwhelms me. Psalm 38:3-4(NLT)

2. I'm certain that God sees our _____, just as Jesus did, for we remind Him of sheep without a shepherd.

Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in love. Joel 2:13(NIV)

3. No matter how many times you bring wayward sheep back, they are _____ because they can't learn from their mistakes.

I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out. For I do not do the good I want to do, but the evil I do not want to do—this I keep on doing. Romans 7:18-19(NLT)

4. Even more than being our shepherd, Jesus became the _____ of the world.

The next day he (John) saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, “Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!” John 1:29(ESV)

5. Often, in our modern world, the noise of life _____ from us, but the Shepherd still calls.

And I have other sheep that are not of this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd.
John 10:16(ESV)

Scan or enter your card or bank account information. 5. Review your donation summary then select *Complete Donation*. Or if you prefer to have your gift automatically withdrawn from your checking or savings account, check that box on the right side of your connection card, “Automating My Giving” or contact the church office and we will provide you with the form you will need to complete in order for us to set that up.
