Or if you prefer to have your gift automatically withdrawn from your checking or savings account, check that box on the right side of your connection card, “Automating My Giving” or contact the church office and we will provide you with the form you will need to complete in order for us to set that up.

A THOUGHT FROM THE PRAYER TEAM

“Everyday Disciples, Sharing Christ, Changing Lives!”

If you find yourself having a hard time praying, using a structured prayer format can be helpful. The **A.C.T.S.** Prayer is a great one to try out. Find a quiet place to spend some time with God, then start with **Adoration** of your Heavenly Father. **Confession** comes next followed by **Thanksgiving**...Thanking God for all He has done and will do in your life. The S stands for **Supplication**. This is the time to make requests from God. Anything from asking for help with a problem you are having, praying for others or asking for help with a decision you need to make. There are other structured prayer formats available... or create one of your own. Carving out a regular time in your life for prayer will help balance your spiritual life.
