

**THE CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION**

Pastor: We begin our worship in the Name of the Father, and of the  Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

**People: Amen**


Pastor: If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us.

**People: But if we confess our sins, God, who is faithful and just, will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.**

(Silence for reflection on God’s Word and for self-examination.)

Pastor: Let us confess our sins to God our Father.

**Pastor:** Almighty God in his mercy has given his Son to die for you and for his sake forgives you all your sins. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins, in the name of the Father, and of the  Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

## **THE SERMON: “The Impossible Option”**

**1. The \_\_\_\_\_ involved in following this engaging young rabbi outweighed the prospect of a life-transforming journey with Him.**

Looking at the man, Jesus felt genuine love for him. “There is still one thing you haven’t done,” he told him. “Go and sell all your possessions and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me.” At this the man’s face fell, and he went away sad, for he had many possessions. Mark 10:21-22(NLT)

**2. We can soft-pedal that \_\_\_\_\_ stuff, not even mentioning self-discipline and sacrificial giving, living and loving.**

Jesus said to everyone, “All who want to come after me must say no to themselves, take up their cross daily, and follow me.” Luke 9:23(CEB)

**3. We are so anxious to talk about "taking up one's cross" that we forget all about how Jesus Himself looked beyond the \_\_\_\_\_ % that was set before Him.**

We do this by keeping our eyes on Jesus, the champion who initiates and perfects our faith. Because of the joy awaiting him, he endured the cross, disregarding its shame. Hebrews 12:2(NLT)

**4. The first problem is it is terribly easy to talk ourselves into believing that \_\_\_\_\_ really is impossible, dangerous, fool-hardy, and otherwise inadvisable.**

On hearing it, many of his disciples said, “This is a hard teaching. Who can accept it?” ... From this time many of his disciples turned back and no longer followed him. John 6:61,66(NIV)

**5. The second problem is that the road down which Jesus \_\_\_\_\_  
\_\_\_\_\_ inevitably leads to a  
cross – and not just for Jesus, at least figuratively.**

For God called you to do good, even if it means suffering, just as Christ suffered for you. He is your example, and you must follow in his steps. 1 Peter 2:21(NLT)

**6. So inevitably, it all comes down to the one thing that we \_\_\_\_\_  
\_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_, of course.**

Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight. Proverbs 3:5-6(NIV)

**7. But we'll never know until, graced by God, we lose our \_\_\_\_\_  
\_\_\_\_\_ and set off down the  
road, hearts quaking, but secretly hunkering to be up-ended, stretched,  
challenged and changed.**

Imitate God, therefore, in everything you do, because you are his dear children. Live a life filled with love, following the example of Christ. He loved us and offered himself as a sacrifice for us. Ephesians 5:1-2(NLT)

### **ANOTHER WAY TO GIVE**

Or if you prefer to have your gift automatically withdrawn from your checking or savings account, check that box on the right side of your connection card, “Automating My Giving” or contact the church office and we will provide you with the form you will need to complete in order for us to set that up.
