SECURITY CAMERA TO BE INSTALLED

The church council appointed a group to continue to look at our safety and security issues. As a preventative measure and in the light of some things that have happened at other churches, that group has recommended to Church Council that we install security cameras within the building and outside. It was their feeling that this would increase our protection of people and property. The church council has approved that proposal and cameras will be installed in the near future. There will be signs that make people aware of this so that no one is surprised about them. The cameras will only record video, not audio and there will be no active monitoring. The group has already developed the policy in terms of who is able to access these videos. That will be extremely limited, once again for the protection of everyone. Thank you for helping us to ensure the safety of our congregation and property.
