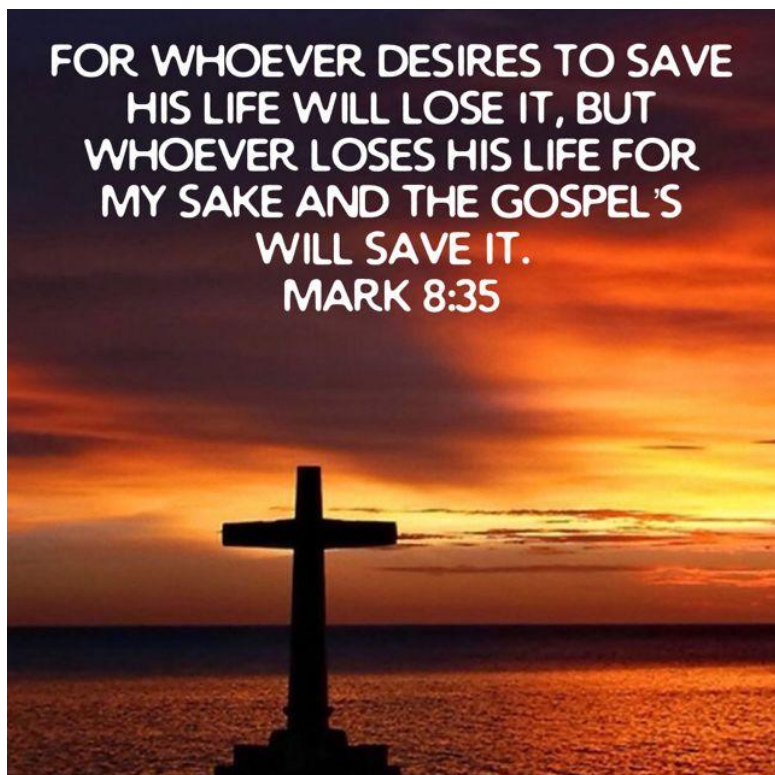

THE CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

ANOTHER WAY TO GIVE

Or if you prefer to have your gift automatically withdrawn from your checking or savings account, check that box on the right side of your connection card, "Automating My Giving" or contact the church office and we will

provide you with the form you will need to complete in order for us to set that up.

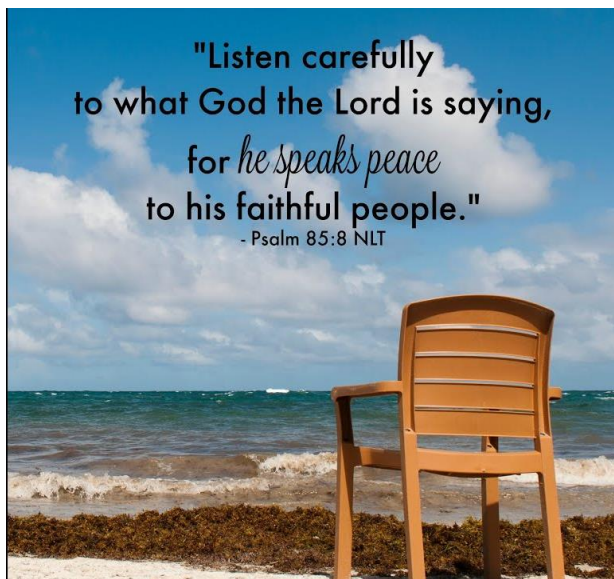
