

THE SIGN OF THE CROSS

One of the outward signs we may use to denote that we are a Christian is the Sign of the Cross. At our baptism it is applied to us both before and after our baptism. Signing does not make us a better Christian, but does remind us that we are not our own. It is in a sense, an outward marking of the inward brand we received at our baptism.

The Signing of the Cross is made whenever the name of the Trinity is spoken. It may also be made as we receive the bread and wine, the body and blood of our Lord, in the Eucharist. The places in the liturgy where it may correctly be used are marked  to assist you in adding this to your worship style if God leads you to do so.

You can make a one-time donation or set up recurring giving right through the app. Select *Add* to add another fund or move forward to the payment information. 4. Scan or enter your card or bank account information. 5. Review your donation summary then select *Complete Donation*. Or if you prefer to have your gift automatically withdrawn from your checking or savings account, check that box on the right side of your connection card, "Automating My Giving" or contact the church office and we will provide you with the form you will need to complete in order for us to set that up.
