

Program Updates:

We’re pleased to share that two more families have recently moved into our Geneva apartments, bringing us to a total of four families in emergency housing including 10 children. Alongside our shelter efforts, we continue to serve additional families across the county through our Diversion, Prevention, and Stabilization Programs. These vital services help us intervene early, keep families together, and prevent homelessness before it starts.
