*\rangle 'Qoph' (k\tilde{o}f) is the nineteenth letter of the Hebrew alphabet. The letter is associated with the concepts of "gather", "circle", or "time", with the ancient form of the letter looking like the sun on the horizon. Psalm 119 is an acrostic poem where each line of each stanza begins with the same letter, and each stanza (letter) praises God for His law (Torah) and His word. The Psalm for today is part of the "Q" section, with the antiphon (verse at the beginning and the same one at the end) from a different Psalm.





Hear us as we pray in His Name and as He has taught us:





A THOUGHT FROM THE PRAYER TEAM

"Everyday Disciples, Sharing Christ, Changing Lives!" Gathering, Growing, Giving, Going

I have a T-shirt with this verse, "Perhaps you were born for such a time as this.", from the book of Esther printed on it. Sometimes when I wear the t-shirt, I strongly feel it as if I'm right where God wants me, living fully in the moment that He created me for. Other times, when I feel lost or unsure, it feels more like a reminder like a quiet whisper calling me back to my purpose.

That's the beautiful miracle of walking with God.... purpose isn't always loud or obvious, but it is always there. And prayer is how we find it again. Some days we feel strong and certain, like Esther walking into the king's court. Other days, we feel like the verse on the shirt is ahead of us, inviting us to believe it. But wherever each of us is, in our walk, prayer connects our heart back to God's calling.
