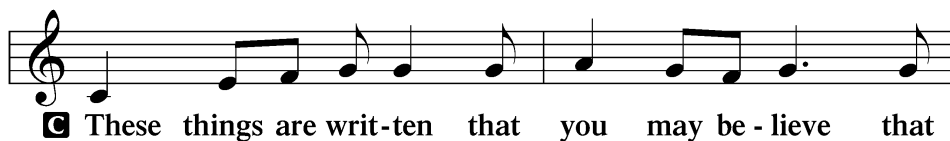

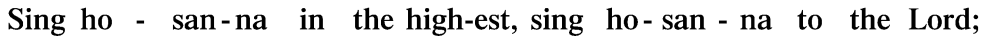

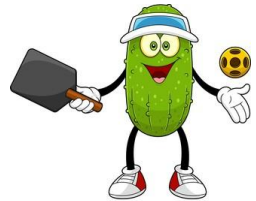
THERE IS STILL ROOM!

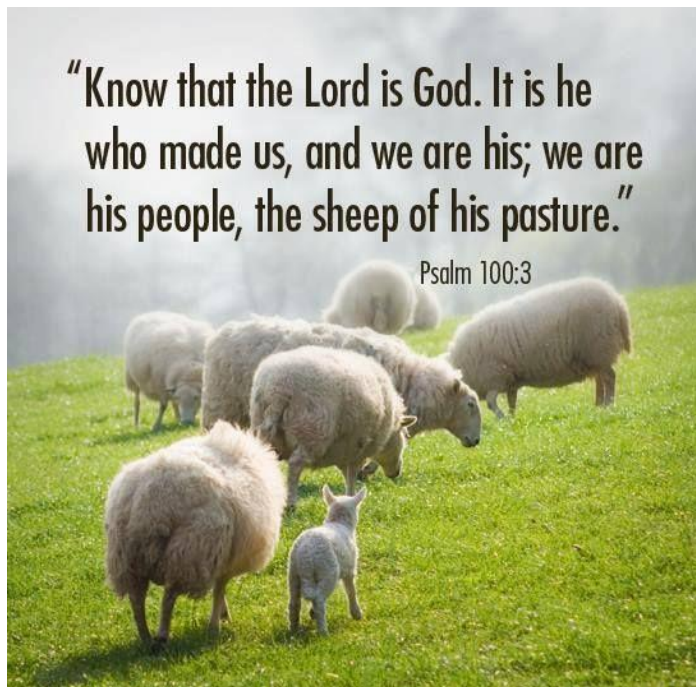
