

### **Old Testament Reading**

Ezekiel 34: 11 - 24

<sup>11</sup>"For thus says the LORD GOD: Behold, I, I myself will search for my sheep and will seek them out. <sup>12</sup>As a shepherd seeks out his flock when he is among his sheep that have been scattered, so will I

seek out my sheep, and I will rescue them from all places where they have been scattered on a day of clouds and thick darkness. <sup>13</sup>And I will bring them out from the peoples and gather them from the countries, and will bring them into their own land. And I will feed them on the mountains of Israel, by the ravines, and in all the inhabited places of the country. <sup>14</sup>I will feed them with good pasture, and on the mountain heights of Israel shall be their grazing land. There they shall lie down in good grazing land, and on rich pasture they shall feed on the mountains of Israel. <sup>15</sup>I myself will be the shepherd of my sheep, and I myself will make them lie down, declares the LORD GOD. <sup>16</sup>I will seek the lost, and I will bring back the strayed, and I will bind up the injured, and I will strengthen the weak, and the fat and the strong I will destroy. I will feed them in justice.

I am the LORD; I have spoken."

### **Psalm**

Psalm 119: 169-176; antiphon: v. 176

ת Taw\*

\*ה 'Taw' (tau) is the twenty-second and last letter of the Hebrew alphabet. The letter is associated with the concept of a "mark" or "tally", similar to how we use a √ or an x. The original pictograph was in the form of a cross – interestingly it is the last letter in אמת (emet), meaning truth (Hebrew reads right to left). Psalm 119 is an acrostic poem where each line of each stanza begins with the same letter, and each stanza (letter) praises God for His law (Torah) and His word. The Psalm for today is the "T" section at the end of the psalm.

<sup>169</sup>Let my cry come before you, O LORD; give me understanding according to your word! <sup>170</sup>Let my plea come before you; deliver me according to your word. <sup>171</sup>My lips will pour forth praise, for you teach me your statutes. <sup>172</sup>My tongue will sing of your word, for all your commandments are right. <sup>173</sup>Let your hand be ready to help me, for I have chosen your precepts. <sup>174</sup>I long for your salvation, O LORD, and your law is my delight. <sup>175</sup>Let my soul live and praise you, and let your just decrees help me. <sup>176</sup>I have gone astray like a lost sheep; seek your servant, for I do not forget your commandments.

### **Epistle Reading**

1 Timothy 1:5–17

<sup>5</sup>The aim of our charge is love that issues from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith. <sup>6</sup>Certain persons, by swerving from these, have wandered away into vain discussion, <sup>7</sup>desiring to be teachers of the law, without understanding either what they are saying or the things about which they make confident assertions.


<sup>8</sup>Now we know that the law is good, if one uses it lawfully, <sup>9</sup>understanding this, that the law is not laid down for the just but for

the lawless and disobedient, for the ungodly and sinners, for the unholy and profane, for those who strike their fathers and mothers, for murderers, <sup>10</sup>the sexually immoral, men who practice homosexuality, enslavers, liars, perjurers, and whatever else is contrary to sound doctrine, <sup>11</sup>in accordance with the glorious gospel of the blessed God with which I have been entrusted.

LORD, because he judged me faithful, appointing me to his service, <sup>13</sup>though formerly I was a blasphemer, persecutor, and insolent opponent. But I received mercy because I had acted ignorantly in unbelief, <sup>14</sup>and the grace of our LORD overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. <sup>15</sup>The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the foremost. <sup>16</sup>But I received mercy for this reason, that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display his perfect patience as an example to those who were to believe in him for eternal life. <sup>17</sup>To the King of ages, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honor and glory forever and ever. Amen.





## → Service of the Sacrament →




### **Proclamation of Christ**

forever and ever. Amen.





### Sunday School classes for adults:

Join Sandy Voigt's Class in it study of the Gospel of John. Our class is finishing its study of the Gospel of John by Warren Wiersbe and it ISN'T too late to join! We are in the final chapters of John's insights into Jesus. Come join us! This study will run through to Thanksgiving and then the class will choose another study. (A book can be ordered for you. - Jill Persson's class will be studying Jeremiah, Lamentations: A Comprehensive Verse-by-Verse Exploration of the Bible by Barbara Ferguson. - Bob Smith's class will be studying the version of Holy Week and Jesus' resurrection found in the Gospel of Mark. After Thanksgiving, this class will study 1 & 2 Thessalonians – the Gospel of the End Times. These are Bible studies, no additional books are needed.

And of course, there is Sunday School for children!


