

*v 'Sin and Shin' (sin and shin) is the twenty-first letter of the Hebrew alphabet. The letter is associated with "tooth" or "teeth. With the dot on the left, it is pronounced like an 's' and with the dot on the right, like 'sh'. Psalm 119 is an acrostic poem where each line of each stanza begins with the same letter, and each stanza (letter) praises God for His law (Torah) and His word. The Psalm for today is part of the "S/Sh" section.







→ Service of the Sacrament →
